ATTENTION: NEW LAUNCH LOCATION

The Muskingum may be mighty, but her water is not particularly quick. Be ready for a steady paddle throughout the trip. Beer Fest awaits at the end of your journey! Paddle one of Ohio's largest rivers and experience the thrill of locking thru the only hand operated lock system left in the world.

- Bring plenty of water, snacks, and sunscreen.
- This paddle is unsupported.
- No transportation is provided.


Volunteers will be out paddling on the river, but this paddle is at your own pace. You may paddle in groups or on your own.

This event is a great chance to see the historic Muskingum Lock and Dam System which is the only remaining hand-operated lock system in our country! The Muskingum River Parkway and its 160-year-old navigation system were designated a National Historic Civil Engineering Landmark by the American Society of Civil Engineers.

NEW Starting Location: Boat ramp and shelter house on a property with a large mowed field on Muskingum River Road approximately 18 minutes from Festival Headquarters and halfway between the Lowell and Devol's Dam Locks (5010 Muskingum River Rd. Lowell, OH 45744)

Thirsty? Check out the new dock at the House of Wines where refreshments will be available for purchase! Located river left, about a mile past Devol's Dam!

MOV'N DRAGONS' DRAGON BOAT EXHIBITION

Sunday, 1pm @ Broughton Boathouse (814 Gilman Avenue, Marietta)

The MOV'n Dragons of the Mid-Ohio Valley, Marietta's dragon boat team, will be offering an opportunity for the public to view the dragon boat during the RTA Festival. Enjoy an exhibition of one of the world's oldest sports at the Broughton Boathouse, 814 Gilman Avenue, Marietta. Witness the MOV'n Dragons as they display their boat and demonstrate the ancient art of Dragon Boating. Those interested in learning about Dragon boating can watch from the shoreline or from their own canoe or kayak.

A dragon boat is 40 feet long and can hold 20 paddlers sitting in pairs. A drummer sits in front, and a steersperson is in the back keeping the boat on course.

Dragon Boating originated in China more than 2000 years ago and today is a popular sport worldwide. The MOV'n Dragons have been boating on the Muskingum River for the past 16 years and honor the memory of their founder, Gretchen Feldmaier. We welcome all women over the age of 18 to join us in "Awakening the Dragon within us".

FRIENDS OF THE OHIO RIVER ISLANDS

The Friends of the Ohio River Islands is a volunteer organization that promotes conservation activities, education and outreach to the larger community in support of the Ohio River Islands National Wildlife Refuge. Currently we are focusing our energy on conservation and restoration work on Buckley Island (Marietta OH/Williamstown WV) and Middle Island (St. Marys WV/Newport OH), and educational programs at the OHio River Islands National Wildlife Refuge at the Visitor's Center in Williamstown, WV. OHIO RIVER ISLANDS NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE

The Ohio River Islands National Wildlife Refuge protects, conserves and restores 22 Ohio River islands and the surrounding underwater habitat for native wildlife, with an emphasis on freshwater mussels and migratory birds. All the islands are open to the public for day use and most islands are only accessible by boat, which helps to preserve their increasingly wild character. BROUGHTON NATURE AND WILDLIFE EDUCATION AREA

The Broughton Foundation is a private, not-for-profit, organization established in 1991 by Carl and Elizabeth Broughton. The primary focuses of the Foundation are to manage the Broughton Nature and Wildlife Education Area, Rudolph Family Park and the Elizabeth S. Broughton Community Building. The Broughton Nature and Wildlife Education Area, features 540 acres of forested lands with 14-miles of hiking and mountain biking trails, a paved 1.5-mile Devola Multi-Use Trail, two 18-hole disc golf courses, two fishing ponds, streams and waterfalls, and several areas of undisturbed natural habitat for wildlife education, environmental study, and other public uses. In 2022, the Rudolph family donated approximately 160-acres of adjoining property to the Foundation. Identified separately as Rudolph Family Park, this generous gift added more than 7-miles of woodland trails to the network and serves as a vital link to connect the Broughton complex with the Marietta Trail System. The resulting 700-acre complex of trails and natural areas is reserved for all non-motorized use by the public. For more information, visit https:// thebroughtonfoundation.org/

TRAILS-BIKING



Bring your bicycles to town! FREE organized road and mountain bike rides will be happening during the daytime on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. Other bike-friendly events this year will include Family Fun rides, The Tortoise θ Hare Race, and a town Scavenger Hunt (by bike!)!

For the longer road and trail rides, stop in to get directions & maps to head out on your own, or join the group rides Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. You set your own pace. Group rides have ride leaders, but are unsupported. Don't forget all necessary gear, helmet, snacks, and water!

Mountain bike rentals are available from Marietta Adventure Company.

MOUNTAIN BIKING

All group rides will take place on the Marietta City Trail System, 30+ miles of quality single-track trails ready for action! The trail system is accessible from downtown, making it easy to head back for a burger and brew after your ride!

Also nearby, the Wayne National Forest boasts 40 miles of slightly more technical riding and Mountwood Park has an incredible trail system as well. If you head that direction (on your own), come back to town for evening fun!

ROAD BIKING

Washington County boasts some of the most scenic road riding in the state! Cruise out for the morning or afternoon and enjoy scenic farms, hilly wooded landscapes, and nicely paved roads.

All group rides leave from East Muskingum Park. Check the schedule for route options. If you prefer to head out on your own, stop by to pick up a free map and route directions.

RTA JAM SESSION

Thursday 6-7pm @ Gunlock Park

Start the weekend off right at Gunlock Park hitting the pump track, dirt jumps, and beginner trails. Then head over to the RTA Festival kick-off party at the Marietta Brewing Company. The park is spectator friendly so feel free to just come and hang out. Gunlock Park is located directly behind Lowe's in Marietta on SR 7 (842 Pike St). Don't forget your helmet!



TRAILS-HIKING & RUNNING

BROUGHTON'S NATURE AND WILDLIFE EDUCATION AREA HIKE Saturday and Sunday, 8:30am @ GWB Complex #1 picnic shelter (639 SR 821, Marietta)

Explore Broughton's Nature & Wildlife Education Area with a hike leader on a 3 to 4.5 mile hike. Hikers will have the option of exploring the Broughton Nature & Wildlife Education Area or the new Rudolph Family Park trails on each day as well as learn about other uses and recreation opportunities on these properties.

Depending on the length, hikes will last 1.5 to 2.5 hours. Participants are urged to wear comfortable footwear or hiking shoes/boots, carry drinking water, and be prepared for the physical challenges posed by hiking on uneven trails and elevation changes.





GNOME ADVENTURE HIKE

Friday at 9am & 5:30pm @ Ohio River Islands Wildlife Refuge (3982 Waverly Road, Williamstown, WV)

The gnomes have found another location to also hide this year: The Ohio River Islands Wildlife Refuge in Williamstown, WV:

There are multiple family friendly trail options from .1 miles to 2 miles.
